
Top 10 Ways to add a Cat to your home

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- 10. Be sure your cat's microchip info is up to date, or has an id tag on the collar or harness
- 9. Use feliway spray on the lower 2 feet of all door frames, table legs and furniture
- 8. Rub the head of each existing cat and your hands on a kitchen towel. Rub this onto the head of the new cat to co scent. Do this once daily.
- 7. Follow rank the oldest cat is fed first, petted and played with first.
- 6. 10 minutes per cat/day of play with a human where the cat thinks he "killed" the toy.
- 5. Minimum of 3 perches per cat each cat has own bed and small food bowls separate



- 3. No yelling, spray bottles, throwing things, electronic devices or hitting cats
- 2. Introduce by feeding each cat next to the door on opposite sides until each cat is eating calmly. Then allow cats to be together for a few hours at a time until no hissing, staring or swatting.

And the number one thing to do when bringing in a new cat to your present cat -

1. Provide a pathway off the floor for your cat to move past children, dogs, and other cats.

If your cat is over 8 years old, and continues to be upset by a new kitty, take this kitty in for an exam. Hidden pain is often the culprit for "cranky kitties"
